

Flood Impacted Parks



COUNCIL UPDATE

The original scope of relocation works for flood-impacted furniture and equipment has been revised in response to feedback from the community.

At the beginning of 2023, Council advised the community of a plan for equipment in various parks across the region impacted by extreme rainfall to be relocated to neighbouring parks, where possible, to reduce future repair costs while still ensuring the community has access to appropriate facilities.

Following the community's feedback, Council has reassessed this project and will now be retaining more infrastructure than originally indicated.

Below are details of the scope of work for each of the parks. Council will continue to assess equipment damaged in future weather events on a case-by-case basis.

ANZAC PARK, GRANTHAM

Remove rope swing – replacing with playground & springers from Bugler Park

Remove rubber fall zones – replacing with rubber wear pads and new soft fall

Install new shade sail

Repair concrete paths



BUGLER PARK, GRANTHAM

Remove playground and springers – relocating to Anzac Park

Remove shade sail

Repair damaged concrete footpaths, BBQ and sign

Revitalise garden beds and turf

Retain toilet block



MCGARVA PARK, GRANTHAM

Remove BBQ – new BBQ to be installed in the Upper Grantham Parklands

Remove shelter and concrete slab



EDMUND PARK, MULGOWIE

Retain shelter and bin



LIONS PARK, LOWER TENTHILL

Remove play equipment, BBQs and one bin

Retain shelters, toilets and one bin



NARDA LAGOON PARK (SOUTH), LAIDLEY

Remove BBQ

Retain remaining infrastructure
